

Professor William Park, Boston University

William W. (Rusty) Park is Professor of Law at Boston University, where he lectures on tax, banking and international business transactions.

After studies at Yale and Columbia, Park practiced in Paris until returning home to teach and to direct his university's Center for Banking and Financial Law. He has held visiting academic appointments at Cambridge University and The Fletcher School, as well as in Dijon, Hong Kong, Auckland and Geneva. His books include *Arbitration of International Business Disputes*, *International Forum Selection*, *International Chamber of Commerce Arbitration* (with Craig and Paulsson), *International Commercial Arbitration* (with Reisman, Craig and Paulsson) and *Income Tax Treaty Arbitration* (with David Tillinghast).



Park is General Editor of *Arbitration International* and a Vice President of the London Court of International Arbitration, as well as a member of the Board of the American Arbitration Association and the NAFTA Financial Services Roster.

Park was appointed by former Federal Reserve Board Chairman Paul Volcker to the Claims Resolution Tribunal in Zürich, charged with resolving claims by Holocaust victims and their heirs against Swiss banks. He also served on the London-based Appeals Tribunal of the International Commission on Holocaust Era Insurance Claims, presided by former Secretary of State Eagleburger.

A member of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration (ICCA), Park is also past Chair of the ABA Committee on International Commercial Dispute Resolution. He arbitrates in French as well as English, and has heard cases in England, France, Switzerland, Canada, Finland, China, Australia and the United States.

President Bush recently appointed Park to a six year term on the Panel of Arbitrators for the World Bank's International Centre for Settlement of Investment Dispute.
